## **Plan For In Person Worship at St. Luke:**

St. Luke's Council continues to monitor the spread of Covid-19, the hospital dashboard and the rollout of vaccinations in our communities. Pr. Becky is in communication with the Synod Office and other Lutheran Churches of the Nittany Conference regarding in person worship and mitigation efforts. The next St. Luke Council meeting is February 8th and at that time we will discuss and make a plan for in-person worship. Currently in-person worship is suspended through February 7th. Thank you for your continued understanding and patience as we navigate the changing climate and seek to gather together physically in the same space again, but always trusting that God unites us through the Holy Spirit whenever we are apart. Blessings to you and yours and please stay safe and healthy.

**Worship At Home**—The Worship At Home service continues to be posted on the St. Luke Centre Hall YouTube Channel <https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCndvYdWpi7qSKld6Y8cnHMg> for the foreseeable future. If you desire Communion at home, please contact Pr. Becky so that arrangements can be made.

**IMPORTANT - Please Note**—If you do not have email or online access and would like to receive the printed Worship At Home Mailing, please speak with Pastor Becky or Patty or leave a message at the Church Office at 814-364-9154.

**Groups in St. Luke** - The St. Luke Council voted to allow groups to use the building for activities and events. Groups that wish to resume using the building must schedule through the Church office and follow the protocols established for worship including wearing masks, remaining physically distant, answering health questions, and taking attendance for contact tracing. Groups must also designate a person to be the 'Cleaning Person.' Prior to the group's use of the building, the Cleaning Person must contact Pastor Becky, Derek Shaffer or Larry Frazier to set up a time to meet and discuss where the cleaning supplies are and learn the cleaning protocols. Once this meeting has occurred, the group may proceed with in person meetings that abide by current St. Luke policy. Currently the limit is up to 10% capacity for indoor events and gatherings. \*Please be sure to see all policies and procedures for groups and in person worship that is posted in the narthex of St. Luke.



**Lent Amid Covid-19** – The Spiritual Relations Committee and Pr. Becky have been brainstorming ideas throughout the past ten months to bring the church to you in your homes while we continue to be distant for health and safety reasons. While we continue to listen to the recommendation of scientists to determine best practices for when we do gather together, we know that not everyone will be comfortable until a vaccine will be available for everyone.



**Ash Wednesday and Lent Kits**

Whether we are able to be in-person or need to continue to suspend in-person worship the Committee is putting together Lenten Kits. Each kit will have a daily devotional written by Pr. Becky that is similar to the one she wrote for Advent, an Ash Wednesday Worship Service to be used with your household with pre-consecrated Communion and ashes, and possible other goodies.

We are asking You to come and pick up your Kit for your household beginning Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> at St. Luke’s. Kits will be in the Narthex and there will be a paper for you to sign that you have picked up a kit, please mark all households you have picked kits up for. If you need a kit delivered, please contact the church office and leave a message for Pr. Becky or call Pr. Becky’s cell phone, she will be happy to deliver kits as needed. Notes: 1 Kit per household. Kits will be grouped in bins with the number of communion cups designated on the front.


**Prayer Group** – We are gathering in person in the social hall and on Zoom on Wednesday mornings at 10:00 am. We are Always on

**Greetings** from our Synod's Mission Table! We are your siblings in Christ, a small group of people who have been pondering with the Holy Spirit what God's mission is for the Allegheny Synod.

**Have you heard the news?**

We are the church together: We are one of 65 Synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Our Synod is a group of people walking together in a part of God's Kingdom.

**Did you know?**

Our denomination, the ELCA, has stated our shared mission and vision as follows: Our mission is "Together in Jesus Christ we are freed by grace to live faithfully, witness boldly and serve joyfully."

Our vision is "A world experiencing the difference God's grace and love in Christ makes for all people and all creation."

**And?**

In the Allegheny Synod we are 115 churches across seven counties of central Pennsylvania, located between Harrisburg and Pittsburgh. Towns that you may be familiar with in our Synod are State College (home of Penn State University), Clearfield, Altoona, Huntingdon, Bedford, Johnstown, and Somerset. In June of this year, Pastor Becca Ehrlich, the Interim Director for Evangelical Mission of the Allegheny Synod, extended an invitation to share in a time of discernment about what it means for God's people to be in mission together.
