Dear Siblings in Christ,

Am I a broken record? Am I stuck on the same part of the same song, forever repeating the same message of Jesus' teaching that God's love is for ALL, all people, all creation, all the world? I really feel like a broken record, a CD or song stuck eternally on repeat. LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR! Over and over and over again. How many ways can Jesus say to love your neighbor, to care for the other, to be kind? How many ways did Jesus demonstrate this in the three years of his active ministry? How many examples, stories and parables, similes and metaphors did Jesus create to help people to understand God's love is for all people? How many times did Jesus want to shake his head and walk away but responded with compassion and love and tried again and again, a song on repeat, to teach us the ways of God's love?

And yet throughout the gospels, in the parables and stories written down decades after Jesus' death and resurrection, we are told repeatedly in various ways how to love our neighbor and how much God loves us and all the world. Decades later! Mark was first written around the year 70 BCE, nearly 40 years after the resurrection of Christ. And it wasn't as though everyone had access to this gospel, this good news, not in the written form. Most could not read. Most stories, parables and teachings of Jesus were still delivered through oral telling and teaching – through the example of daily living and letters from the first apostles of the early church.

Yes, I absolutely am a broken record, a song on repeat! After more than 2000 years we still struggle to love our neighbor as Jesus teaches us to love our neighbor – to love ALL people as God has created them. Recognize that I said we. I too can struggle to love my neighbor, to have compassion on those I judge as unloving, uncaring, disrespectful, and unkind. While these neighbors need love too, it does not excuse behavior that is unloving to others. When we claim we are Christians, we hold ourselves to Jesus' standard to love our neighbor, ALL our neighbors. I will continue to be a broken record until ALL people know they are loved by God and until we, the people of God, the followers of Christ, disciples, Christians live our daily lives striving to love our neighbor with every breath.

When we say love our neighbor, it is not a romantic love, but a love full of care, kindness, respect, grace, and compassion that Jesus has taught us through his

In Person Worship at St. Luke:

St. Luke has two weekly In-Person worship services at 8:00am and 10:30am.




The St. Luke Lutheran Church Council is calling for a special St. Luke Lutheran Church Congregational Meeting on September 12, 2021 following each of the in-person worship services (8:00 am and 10:30 am) with a Zoom option following the 10:30 worship service. The purpose of this meeting is to vote upon the recommendation from the property committee and the council

to move forward to replace the current oil boiler system with a new natural gas boiler system to be installed spring of 2022. The bid recommended from the council is for \$55,000; this includes approximately \$10,000 for unforeseen costs. Should the Congregation vote to move forward with this bid, the council would approve the Treasurer to secure the bid with a 10% down payment.
