You are also invited to join in a hearing on the social statement. Hearings are being held at most of the Spring Conference Meetings, including Nittany Conference on April $22^{\rm nd}$. At hearings on the social statement the convener will ask for comments on each part of the social statement. To comment at one of the hearings, please review and study the social statement and come with prepared comments. You are welcome to come to hearings to listen to what others have to say.

Why should you care? The ELCA is the work of the people and strives to represent the views of members while fulfilling the call to follow Jesus in ministry in this place. While we will never have a perfect representation of all people, since no two people think exactly the same way, it is important for us to come to a common understanding of how we can best follow Jesus in this world and our context. I encourage you to share your comments through the survey at the link above, pick up a paper survey that can be mailed, or join a hearing on the Civic Life and Faith Social Statement. For more information or questions, please contact me and I will do my best to help. Thank you for your support of the work we do in the name of Jesus.



Allegheny Synodical Women's Organization

At the annual convention of the Allegheny Synodical Women's Organization in October, the voting members made the hard decision to dissolve our synodical unit, effective January 31, 2024. This follows many years of declining active congregational units, dwindling donations and finally being unable to fill the leadership positions despite the very dedicated efforts of several of the most recent board members.

Seed money from the treasury will be managed by the Synod to continue future Day of Renewal events. Also the Lutheran World Relief collection where St. Luke's sewing group sends their quilts and school kits will continue through the Synod Office.

Many congregations continue to have very active women's groups, like our sewing group, carrying out wonderful projects. It is hoped that these groups will continue to let us know about their activities through the Synod Office and the Lutheran Letter.
