

# THE ST. LUKE LETTER November 2024

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I am writing this as we are approaching the presidential election. Over the past several years we as a nation have found ourselves in more and more contentious disagreement. At times we are unable to communicate with kindness and instead express disdain for anyone who doesn't agree with "us." I don't think I need to elaborate too much on this, as you all surely have stories of relationships that are in disrepair or have even died away. My heart hurts for the despair we feel as a community and a nation. And this despair and even fear come into church just as it comes into any other place or relationship. This needs to change and we have work to do.

You may be wondering why I would begin with a topic that is separate from the church – the idea of separation of church and state. But the way we live should reflect our beliefs and the way of Christ. Living our daily life guided by God's love is part of what it means to be a follower of Jesus, and dare I say disciple. I will not tell you how to vote, but I do encourage you to vote. It is our civic duty to participate, and we are called to live in the world guided by God. We may not agree on how exactly that should be done, but we are to do it together.

We have work to do – in the church and in the communities where we live and reside. We are to strive for God's peace and justice, as we promised in baptism and affirmation of baptism. We are to work towards the common good and care for our neighbor. We certainly have great ways we do this through the Food Pantry and our very active quilting ministry. Yet we could do more. But for us to do more we need to be a presence and listen to the needs and cares of those around us. We need to talk and listen with our neighbors – I cannot say this enough. We typically have little to no problem talking with friends, family, and even acquaintances, but we shy away from people we don't know. It is hard to talk to new people because there are so many unknowns; however, God calls us into relationship as well as into ministry.

We have work to do – how will we do it? This is not just my concern or your concern. It is God's concern for us to care for one another. And God is with us as we try ways to connect with our neighbors, especially the ones we don't know yet. What are things we could do or support to be more known in the community as the loving people at St. Luke? How can we bring church to the people and go beyond waiting for people to come to us? I encourage us to all pray for guidance and to be willing to follow the Holy Spirit as we live as church together in this place. Thank you for your ministry and your love of God and neighbor.




Dear St. Luke Congregation,


