

### THE ST. LUKE LETTER May 2025

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I often get asked, "What do you do?" or "Why do you do that?" Sometimes it's in reference to how I spend my days as a pastor in general. Other times, it's more about why I spend so much time out in the community, away from our individual congregation.

At the heart of those questions, I hear a deeper curiosity—what does it mean to live a life of faith, not just in the sanctuary on Sunday morning, but in the everyday places where we live, learn, serve, and lead?

Our faith was never meant to stay within the walls of a building. Jesus certainly didn't keep his ministry confined to one place. He walked roads, entered homes, met people in marketplaces, and sat with those on the margins. If we are to follow him, then we are called to do the same: to carry our faith into the world, where it becomes visible not just in what we say, but in how we serve, listen, and show up.

That's why you might find me at a community ministry meeting, in a conversation with a local official or standing with others in peaceful witness for justice. Far from being distractions from the 'real' work of ministry, these moments of advocacy and service *are* ministry. They are expressions of love for neighbor and hope for the common good.

Advocacy, especially, is about raising our voices when others are not heard. It's about using the influence we have, not for personal gain, but to help shape a world that more closely reflects God's kingdom—one of mercy, justice, and peace. This call is deeply rooted in scripture. The prophets lifted their voices. Jesus walked this road. And we, too, are called to follow.

This isn't always easy. It takes time, patience, and the willingness to be uncomfortable. But it's also holy work. It is the daily rhythm of putting our faith into action—wherever we are, with whomever we meet. This is why it is important to show up and participate in things like Lutheran Day in the Capitol, sponsored by Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa). LAMPa's Mission Statement is, *In response to God's love in Jesus Christ, we advocate for wise and just public policies in Pennsylvania that promote the common good.* When we join our voices to advocate for those suffering injustice, we participate in God's work and our baptismal calling to "strive for justice and peace in all the earth" (*Affirmation of Baptism, Evangelical Lutheran Worship*).

So yes, part of my calling is to be with you on Sunday mornings. But it's also to be out there, in the community, walking alongside others, lifting up what matters, and witnessing to God's presence in all places. Because faith that is lived only on Sunday isn't the full picture. Real faith moves. It listens. It serves. And it shows up. So thank you for asking why I am involved beyond the congregation's walls – because we are church that not only gathers, but that reaches out in love to the world God so dearly loves.

**FOOD PANTRY:** The Centre Hall/Penns Valley Food Pantry is located in the lower level of Grace United Methodist Church. The monthly distribution day is the Third Tuesday of each month from 1:30-3pm except for August when it is held the second Tuesday. In case of an emergency, a coordinator can always be contacted for a food distribution. The next monthly food distribution will be held on **Tuesday**, **May 20**, **2025**, at Grace United Methodist Church, Centre Hall. Volunteers are needed to pack and distribute boxes from **8:00am-4:00 pm**.

Now that the Food Pantry is serving all of Penns Valley, the monthly need more than doubled. We are now serving over 110 families so any help you could provide would be greatly appreciated. The most needed items typically remain shelf stable items like canned goods, cereals, pastas, etc.; however, there is an emphasis item each month that is listed below. If you would like to make a donation, please place non-perishable items in the designated Food Pantry Box located in the narthex at St. Luke Lutheran

Church on or before **Sunday, May 18, 2025.** You may also make a monetary donation by specifying a designated amount on your offering envelope, by making a check payable to St. Luke with "Food Pantry" in the memo line and placing it in the offering plate, or by placing a cash donation in an envelope in the offering plate that is specially marked for Food Pantry.

#### **Seizing holy opportunities**


In *Holy Moments*, Matthew Kelly discusses the world's need for more small (but sometimes large) instances of people caring for others, cultivating joy, encouragement and love instead of anger, envy, fear. Kelly defines a Holy Moment as "a single moment in which you open yourself to God. ... You set aside personal preference and self-interest, and for one moment you do what you prayerfully believe God is telling you to do." This may mean mowing the lawn for a neighbor with a broken leg, praising a child on his artwork, buying a surprise snack for someone having a bad day, working extra shifts for a coworker with cancer so she can receive her full salary while out

sick, paying for the next car's drive-thru

order. Anyone can create a Holy Moment, because you don't need special skills, position or wealth. "If you want to see miracles, make yourself available to God," Kelly suggests. He adds that God has a track record of collaborating with "the most unlikely people to make amazing things happen, and now He wants to collaborate with you." When we're open to God's leading, holy opportunities abound. And we will experience as much joy as the ones to whom we show care.
