



## THE ST. LUKE LETTER

March 2026

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Lent has a way of meeting us in the middle of ordinary life. One moment we are moving through daily routines — watching the news, making meals, keeping appointments, carrying concerns for family and friends — and the next we hear the words: *“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”*

Lent invites us into the wilderness and sometimes it looks like:

- A kitchen table covered in papers.
- A waiting room chair.
- A house that feels too quiet.
- A television that never seems to stop talking.
- A mind that won't slow down at night.

Many of us are not overwhelmed because we are doing too little. We are overwhelmed because we are carrying too much. This year, what if Lent is not about adding more — but about making space? Space to breathe. Space to listen. Space to remember that God is already near and has named us beloved.

We know that faith doesn't happen in a vacuum or only when we are in a church building. Faith is with us everywhere and in Lent we have a chance to recognize God's presence, God's love, God's grace.

God is with us at the kitchen table before we turn on the television. Maybe we welcome God's presence at the table and sit for one quiet minute and pray, “Lord, you are here.”

God is with us in the waiting room, a real room or one of our own making. Maybe when worry rises we breathe slowly and repeat, “Into your hands, O God.”

God is with us before bed, as we reflect on the day or try to numb our minds. Maybe we turn off the news and the noise thirty minutes earlier. If silence is challenging, maybe we read a Psalm instead — perhaps 23 or 46 or 121.

God is with us when we are on the phone or in a conversation. Maybe if a conversation becomes tense, we pause before responding recognizing that silence can be holy.

Lent is not a spiritual competition. It is an invitation. What noise might God be inviting you to turn down this season?

- Prayer before headlines
- Replacing one complaint with one gratitude
- Three minutes of quiet each day

Jesus went into the wilderness not to accomplish more — but to remember who he was. Beloved. That is where Lent leads us too. You are beloved. May this season be honest, gentle, and spacious — and may you find Christ meeting you in the middle of real life.

**FOOD PANTRY:** The Centre Hall/Penns Valley Food Pantry is located in the lower level of Grace United Methodist Church. The monthly distribution day is the Third Tuesday of each month from 1:30-3pm except for August when it is held the second Tuesday. In case of an emergency, a coordinator can always be contacted for a food distribution. The next monthly food distribution will be held on **Tuesday, March 17, 2026**, at Grace United Methodist Church, Centre Hall. Volunteers are needed to pack and distribute boxes from **8:00am-4:00 pm**.

Now that the Food Pantry is serving all of Penns Valley, the monthly need more than doubled. We are now serving over 110 families so any help you could provide would be greatly appreciated. The most needed items typically remain shelf stable items like canned goods, cereals, pastas, etc.; however, there is an emphasis item each month that is listed below. If you would like to make a donation, please place non-perishable items in the designated Food Pantry Box located in the narthex at St. Luke Lutheran Church on or before **Sunday, March 15, 2026**. You may also make a monetary donation by specifying a designated amount on your offering envelope, by making a check payable to St. Luke with "Food Pantry" in the memo line and placing it in the offering plate, or by placing a cash donation in an envelope in the offering plate that is specially marked for Food Pantry.

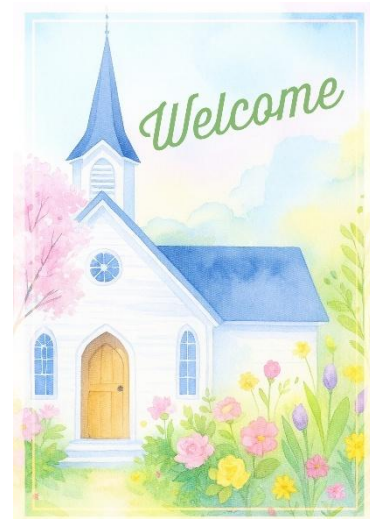
